Who supports the AOP-20 Council's work?

- Conveners ESC's and IHE's
- Planning Team comprised of 12-14 members widely representative of the 9 counties and organizations who meet to plan, organize, support, and evaluate the work of the AOP-20 Council
- Council Teams Council members who actively engage in teams helping the council reach the goals of the strategic plan.

- Network of Champions Individuals in positions of influence, widely known by their communities who will share the vision and work of the AOP-20, serve as a sounding board, and connect AOP-20 to other networks, funding sources, legislators, and other opportunities.
 - Ascribe to the AOP-20 Vision
 - Help in sharing the AOP-20 story with others when appropriate
 - ❖ As needed, serve as a sounding board and in an advisory capacity to AOP-20 leadership
 - Recommend other network champions
 - Connect AOP-20 to other networks, funding sources, legislators, other opportunities
 - Attend an annual fall Breakfast of Champions-Date: Friday, October 16, 2016, location to be announced at a later date
 - Receives an annual report of the AOP-20 accomplishments
 - Have a standing invitation to AOP-20 Council meetings
 - Support having his/her name listed as an AOP-20 champion





